



Directions to Radcliffe Yard Sunken Garden for the Wednesday Night Reception

DESTINATION: SUNKEN GARDEN (NEXT TO LONGFELLOW HALL), APPIAN WAY, CAMBRIDGE, MA 02138, NEAR THE INTERSECTION OF APPIAN AND BRATTLE.

FROM LOGAN INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

☐ By Taxi Cab

A taxi is the easiest (but not the most economical) way to get from Logan to Cambridge. The ride can take up to 45 minutes (depending upon traffic in the Callahan Tunnel) and the fare runs from \$20-30. Instruct the driver to proceed to Harvard Square, then onto Garden Street, and then Appian Way (a one-way street). Longfellow Hall is the brick building on your right. The sunken garden is to the right of Longfellow hall (if you are looking at it from Appian Way).

☐ By Public Transport

Public transportation on the "**T**" (Boston's MBTA subway system) costs 85 cents. Free shuttle buses from Logan to the "**T**" station circulate among airline terminals every 8-12 minutes. Proceed to the bus with a flashing "SUBWAY" sign that will pass outside your terminal (on the lower level) and take it to the subway station. The "**T**" runs on four different colored lines through Downtown Boston and the surrounding areas, including Cambridge. The four lines are Red, Blue, Green, and Orange. You will first take the *Blue Line inbound* (headed towards Bowdoin) four stops into **GOVERNMENT CENTER**. Transfer to the *Green Line outbound* (any car will do: "B" headed towards Boston College; "C" headed towards Cleveland Circle; "D" headed towards Riverside; or "E" headed towards Heath Street). Go one stop to **PARK STREET**. At **PARK STREET**, proceed one level down and transfer to the *Red Line outbound* (headed towards Alewife) and take the train four stops to **HARVARD**. At the Harvard "T" Stop, proceed to the Church Street exit (go out the "Harvard Square" staircase and not the "Harvard Yard" staircase). Once above ground, you should be facing the Body Shop Store, and across Church Street from that store is the Unitarian Universalist Church. You are now on Church Street. Proceed down Church Street until you hit Brattle Street (the end of Church Street). Turn right on Brattle and proceed two blocks to Appian Way. The Loeb Drama Center will be on your left, just for reference.; Turn right on Appian Way. Longfellow Hall is the brick building on the left, across from the Gutman Library (corner of Brattle Street and Appian Way). The sunken garden is to the right of Longfellow hall (if you are looking at it from Appian Way).

BY AUTOMOBILE

If you are planning to drive to Cambridge and have not experienced Boston-area driving, be prepared for a challenge. Street names change frequently, and they are often not visibly marked. Few maps indicate directions for the town's numerous one-way streets, and traffic moves quite quickly. Appian Way is a one-way street with traffic moving from Garden Street to Brattle Street. Be prepared to be lost at least once before arriving at your destination.

☐ From Points North of Boston

Take Route 93 South into Boston. Take the exit for Storrow Drive/Cambridge. *FOLLOW STORROW DRIVE* (at certain points called Soldiers Field Road), keeping to the right along the Charles River until the exit marked "Harvard Square/Cambridge." (Do not be fooled by the Cambridge exit signs; be patient and wait for Harvard Square.)

At the Harvard Square exit make a right and *CROSS OVER THE CHARLES RIVER* on Anderson Bridge to John F. Kennedy Street. Continue straight through traffic lights at Memorial Drive, Eliot Street, and Mount Auburn Street, getting into the left lane after crossing Eliot Street. The next traffic light will put you in the center of Harvard Square, facing a newsstand called "Nini's Corner." Take a sharp left; then bear right immediately onto Brattle Street. Continue up Brattle Street for three blocks and you will see Appian Way on your right. Longfellow Hall is the brick building on your right, adjacent to the parking lot on the corner of Appian Way and Brattle Street. The sunken garden is to the right of Longfellow hall (if you are looking at it from Appian Way).

▣ From Points South of Boston

Take Route 3 (southeast Expressway) North from the intersection with Route 128. In Boston, take the Storrow Drive exit and *FOLLOW STORROW DRIVE* (at certain points called Soldiers Field Road), keeping to the right along the Charles River until the exit marked "Harvard Square/Cambridge." (Do not be fooled by the Cambridge exit signs; be patient and wait for Harvard Square.)

At the Harvard Square exit make a right and *CROSS OVER THE CHARLES RIVER* on Anderson Bridge to John F. Kennedy Street. Continue straight through traffic lights at Memorial Drive, Eliot Street, and Mount Auburn Street, getting into the left lane after crossing Eliot Street. The next traffic light will put you in the center of Harvard Square, facing a newsstand called "Nini's Corner." Take a sharp left; then bear right immediately onto Brattle Street. Continue up Brattle Street for three blocks and you will see Appian Way on your right. Longfellow Hall is the brick building on your right, adjacent to the parking lot on the corner of Appian Way and Brattle Street. The sunken garden is to the right of Longfellow hall (if you are looking at it from Appian Way).

▣ From Points West of Boston

Take Route 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) East. Get off at the Cambridge/Allston exit and follow the signs for Cambridge. Stay in the far left lane and proceed straight ahead through one set of lights, but do not cross the river at this point. Instead, take a left before the bridge. Go through the next set of lights at Western Avenue. This will put you on Storrow Drive. Follow Storrow Drive one half mile to the first exit marked Harvard Square Cambridge. *CROSS OVER THE CHARLES RIVER* on Anderson Bridge to John F. Kennedy Street. Continue straight through traffic lights at Memorial Drive, Eliot Street, and Mount Auburn Street, getting into the left lane after crossing Eliot Street. The next traffic light will put you in the center of Harvard Square, facing a newsstand called "Nini's Corner." Take a sharp left; then bear right immediately onto Brattle Street. Continue up Brattle Street for three blocks and you will see Appian Way on your right. Longfellow Hall is the brick building on your right, adjacent to the parking lot on the corner of Appian Way and Brattle Street. PARKING GARAGES AND LOTS

On-street parking is virtually impossible to find in or around Harvard Square. In many areas, on-street parking is prohibited without a resident parking permit. Listed below are four public parking facilities within walking distance of Longfellow Hall and one parking facility located at the Alewife "T" Station. If

you are planning to drive to Longfellow Hall, we advise you to park before registering for the Institute. Be sure to leave yourself plenty of time to park.

▣ **Church Street Lot (\$20/day)**

The Church Street Lot is the parking area closest to Longfellow Hall. From John F. Kennedy Street, go straight through the traffic lights at Memorial Drive, Eliot Street, and Mount Auburn Street. The next traffic light will put you in the center of Harvard Square, facing a newsstand called “Nini’s Corner.” Take a sharp left at “Nini’s Corner,” then bear right immediately onto Brattle Street. Take the first right onto Church Street, and the parking lot is halfway up the street on your left.

▣ **University Place Garage (\$18/day)**

This parking garage is located three blocks from Longfellow Hall. From John F. Kennedy Street, go straight through the light at the Memorial Drive intersection, then turn left at the first light onto Eliot Street. Go straight through the next light onto Bennett Street. Bennett Street dead-ends onto University Road. Turn left on University Road, and the parking garage is immediately to your right.

▣ **Charles Hotel Parking (\$18/day)**

This parking garage is located across the street from the University Place Garage and below the Charles Hotel. Follow the previous instructions to University Place Garage. When you are on Bennett Street, look for the Charles Hotel parking garage on your left.

▣ **Holyoke Center Parking (\$18/day)**

From John F. Kennedy Street, continue straight through the traffic lights at Memorial Drive and Eliot Street. Turn right at the next light onto Mount Auburn Street. Turn left at the second street onto Holyoke Street. The entrance to the Holyoke Center Garage will be on your left.

▣ **Alewife “T” Station Parking (\$4/day) – taking the public transit (“T”) to Harvard Square**

Parking is available at the Alewife “T” Station at the intersection of Route 2 and Route 16, and midway between Massachusetts Avenue and Fresh Pond Circle. The Alewife “T” Station is located on the Red Line and any train will take you to the Harvard “T” Station (the third stop from Alewife and approximately a five-minute ride). At the Harvard “T” Stop, proceed to the Church Street exit (go out the “Harvard Square” staircase and not the “Harvard Yard” staircase). Once above ground, you should be facing the Body Shop Store and across Church Street from that store is the Unitarian Universalist Church. You are now on Church Street. Proceed down Church Street until you hit Brattle Street (the end of Church Street). Turn right on Brattle and proceed two blocks to Appian Way. The Loeb Drama Center will be on your left, just for reference.; Turn right on Appian Way. Longfellow Hall is the brick building on the left, across from the Gutman Library (corner of Brattle Street and Appian Way). The sunken garden is to the right of Longfellow hall (if you are looking at it from Appian Way).
